Letter from the desk of the Chief Executive Officer

Dear Friends

Thank You for coming to our first event that is hosted in Toronto, Canada. We had been helping people in Srilanka since the war started. However we formally registered "Miracle Family Care" as a charity under the Companies act in Srilanka in 2007. Also we registered "Miracle Family Care Foundation" as a charity in Ontario, Canada in 2005 to provide service and support in Srilanka and other countries.

All the projects that are being carried out in Srilanka and other countries are strictly monitored and used entirely helping the people. As a charity we believe everyone needs to be respected and helped beyond their ethnicity and religious beliefs.

I have personally visited Srilanka soon after Tsunami hit Srilanka and distributed clothes which we shipped from Canada and also helped people financially in the areas where they lost everything. We met the people in the areas like Batticalloa, Pananthura, Mullaitivu and Jaffna and purchased Bicycles, Sewing machines etc to support their livelihood.

Later, in May of 2009, thirty (30) years of civil war ended in Sri Lanka where many thousands of civilians lost their lives in the final war. Since then, MFC has done many projects and following are just a few from the past:

Internally Displaced People (IDP) in thirteen Camps:

- Provided milk powder for children who had no food for several days.
- Provided clothes for the young and the old.
- Provided essentials to pregnant women.
- Provided funding for livelihood projects for struggling families.
- Distributed items worth over \$125,000 donated by a Canadian charity in the re-settled areas. These items were shipped in a 40' container which contained Six hundred (600) shipping cartons of new and nearly new clothes, school bags, shoes, baby needs, walkers, wheel chairs and much more items.
- Distributed a consignment of new clothes from another corporate charity from Canada.
- Provided bi-cycles for those who had to travel far to go to school and work.
- Purchased a Three Wheeled auto for a person with no legs.

Construction:

- Provided funding to build churches in Vavuniya, Killinochchi, Colombo and Hatton.
- Helped to construct temporary homes in Vavuniya.
- Renovated homes without roof and broken walls.

Education:

- Helping a student who is attending the university and another in advanced level.

- For several years we have been providing meal allowance to Good Faith Home of Victory, a girls' orphanage in the north. Since, 2011 we have increased the allowance to around \$ 430 (Rs. 50,000) per month.

Natural Disaster:

- In 2010, Sri Lanka was hit by heavy rains not seen in the past 18 years. More than half a million people were affected by the floods. MFC helped people in Batticaloa by giving cash donations to families who had nowhere to turn for help.

Current Projects:

- Since 2009, MFC has been operating a Boys Hostel for those who were affected by the war and low income families. At present, there are six boys studying in the hostel and three more are being educated from their home. These children are educated in an International school and learn all three official languages of Sri Lanka. This year we moved them to Jaffna St.Johns college to pursue their studies.
- In 2014, we started a pilot project of a Sewing Centre in Katpahapuram to make a living for the unemployed. Katpahapuram project is funded by MFC and overseen by our missionary family. The first six months course (Sewing 101) has been completed by the thirteen students and a graduation ceremony to encourage the students will be conducted in December 2014. In January 2015, these students in Katpahapuram will be trained for another six months (Sewing 102) for an advanced training. We have opened our second location in Vavuniya and forty two(42) widows and disadvantaged students are trained.
- In 2013, we started a Christmas gift program for children in orphanages and for the children of lower income families. Shoe boxes were filled with clothing, school supplies, candies, toys and accessories. This year, we almost doubled our quantity and shipped 500 shoe boxes with gifts.
- In 2014, we started the Widows and Orphans (W&O) pilot project in Mahilangkulam. Six widows who are in desperate need will be awarded with the poultry and cow milking projects. The construction has started and it is towards completion. In December 2014, W&O will be launched in Killinochchi, Pallai & Batticaloa. All livelihood projects will be closely watched and monitored by the MFC staff. MFC needs both Individual and Corporate donors to help us continue this project.
- Providing monthly allowance for a total of fourteen workers from Wannai, Jaffna and Batticaloa.

Future Projects:

- MFC staff met with the physically challenged individuals who have lost one or more of their limbs due to the war and we will be launching a project to offer these individuals employment.

- Redeem girls sold for sex trade. In the coastal area, young girls are being sold for sex trade. We want to rescue or help those who rescue these young girls and provide them safety as well as teach them to be self- employed.
- There are ninety (90) thousand people are widows in Srilanka and ten (10%) of them have lost their limbs due the war. We need help to identify them and help them whatever the way possible.
- There are many students wanted to pursue their higher studies but they are unable to continue their studies due to lack of funds. We met many of them and your help will assist them to continue the studies.

South India (Bangalore)

- Yearly provide funds to Christmas events organized by Bethel Mission in Kolar Goldfields, Bangalore. Fun filled events are organized with meals and gifts for the widows and orphans.

Israel:

- Provides monthly funds to International Fellowship of Christians and Jews (IFCJ). Through *the IFCJ's "Guardians of Israel"* program, we are providing lifesaving assistance to Israel's needy in the form of food, clothing, shelter, medical and emergency care, and other essentials. Also, through their *"On Wings of Eagles" program* we have helped Jews make *Aliyah* (immigrate to Israel) from the former Soviet Union and Ukraine and helped them with their *klitah* (resettlement) needs once they arrived in the Holy Land.
- Ezra Canada – Help Jews make Aliyah from the former Soviet Union.
- Every year supported various ministries working in Israel.

Other Countries:

- Whenever natural disaster occurs we try to help the needy in other countries in whatever ways we can help them. We helped few projects in Poland and Philippines.

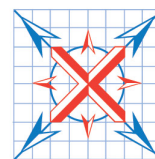
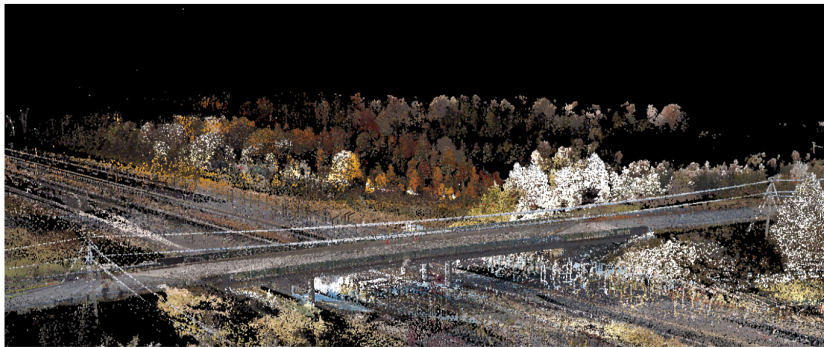
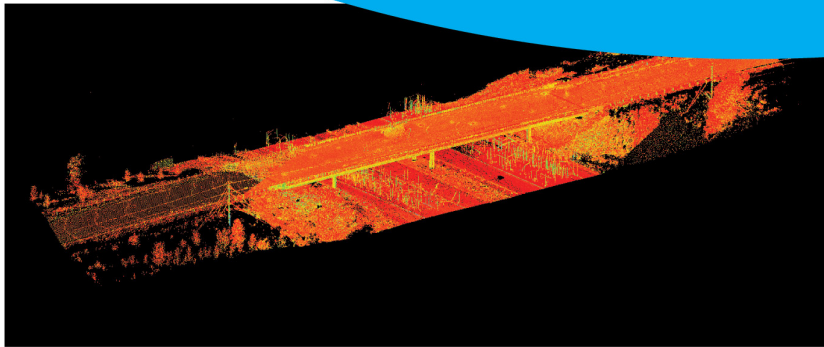

HELPING BOYS FROM THE WAR CAMPS IN THEIR EDUCATION SINCE 2009

Many children who lived in Wanni could not pursue their studies due to constant move from place to place. When we found these kids they were already not attending schools for at least two years. We found an international school that was willing to work with them and helped them to study in the English medium but not in their age and grade level. We provided private tuition and continue to work with them year after year providing training in Music and other activities to bring them to the standard that is needed to follow their age appropriate grades in the school. Finally in 2015 we moved them to St.Johns College, Jaffna from our boys home in Vavuniya to continue their studies in English medium but in their age appropriate grades in school. It was an expensive process however we were committed to make sure they get the best studies in town.



We kept some of the boys from Wanni area in our home situated in Oyyarsinnakulam, Vavuniya and sent them to International School in Vavuniya. Those who lived in Vavuniya we encouraged them to live with their guardians at their homes and attend the international school. We pray for a bright future for them in coming years

HELPING WIDOWS AND DISADVANTAGED WOMEN TO FIND LIVELIHOOD THROUGH TRAINING IN SEWING

We had been travelling and helping disadvantaged group of people since 2002. We had seen many facet of war and migration of people within Tamil Land. That war caused many losses both in live and material things. There are more than ninety (90) thousand widows both young and old in north and east provinces.

We are committed to help these widows to find livelihood through training in sewing. Most of the women who are being trained when interviewed said they wanted to start their own business either from home or in a business area.



There are fifty four (54) widows and others are being given free training on sewing. The teacher herself lost both legs in the war and uses artificial legs to move around. MFC provides her transportation and salary to tech at the center. The students are provided with materials and other essential things free of charges and also the training itself is free of charge. Pupil are excited and enthusiastic in learning and mfc provided certificates to the previous group who completed their training last year.

HELPING WIDOWS AND DISADVANTAGED WOMEN TO FIND LIVELIEHOOD THROUGH TRAINING IN SEWING

Many students completed their studies last year and awarded certificates once they successfully completed their studies. We invited local community leaders to come and encourage them and award the certificates. Most of the students come from very difficult families. Their families are not depending on regular income but receive wages on a day to day basis. These incomes are not guaranteed. They live in huts and other kind of dwellings.

2009 War & Help to our people

The clothes we collected during the time of war sent in a container (over 600 boxes) and were distributed directly to the camps. We also found temporary housing to the families after they had been released from the camps. These families were not native Vavuniya but were scared to return to Wanni with their young girls.

DESPERATE NEEDS OF WANNI STUDENTS IN EDUCATION WHO LOST THEIR PARENTS AND BROTHERS IN WAR

We met many students who were in need of financial assistance to pursue their high school tuition and university education. It was heart breaking to hear passionate stories about their losses of lives and possessions during the war that dragged for thirty (30) years. We interviewed more than fifteen (15) students from Wanni area and most of them lost their father, mother or brothers. Most of them did not have their fathers.

The challenges they face in their daily life is enormous however they were resilient and committed to continue their studies. Their dreams resonate in their voices when they said I wanted to become a judge, a lawyer, a lecturer or a doctor. At times I was moved to see their tears when they shared about their poverty and their mother's sufferings to bring them up and educate and see them successful. Many students go to school hungry and walk long distances to get to schools.



LIVELIHOOD PROJECTS

Handing over goods and money is a temporary help we can provide to those who are in dire needs. However providing them with tools to continuously earn is the best way of helping any individual in need.

We have launched a pilot projects to build chicken cages and provide them with chickens to earn livelihood by multiplying them and selling their eggs in the market. Also buying cows and giving to low income families so that they can sell the milk in the market to earn their livelihood. A good cow can cost from Five hundred (\$500) to Seven hundred and fifty Canadian dollars (\$750) in Srilanka.

Some families are able to multiply the chicken while others are not skilled in taking care of the chicken. Due to the lack of money in buying feed they have failed to multiply the chicken. It is not easy to constantly monitor the recipients however we have employed people to monitor the recipients so that we can expand this project to others.

Another worthwhile project is to supply coconut trees to plant and that would definitely take some time before they get benefits from such projects.



PROJECT TO HELP WIDOWS

There are ninety (90) thousand widows had been identified in Srilanka after the war. Most of them lives in northern and eastern part of Srilanka. More than ten thousand (10,000) lost their limbs and are unable to earn their livelihood. It is a great task to identify and help them with their needs. We collect used good sarees and clothes and ship them to Srilanka and distribute them to the widows. We often find it hard to convince the custom officers and avoid paying duties on these items. We have also provided one time financial help to support them and show them we care and love them.



CHRISTMAS SHOE BOX PROGRAM FOR NEEDY

We sent more than five hundred (500) boxes to different cities in Srilanka. We sent gift boxes to Mannar, Vavuniya, Kandy, Batticaloa, Malawi and Chavakacheri areas to be distributed among the poor and needy children. The children in the orphanages are excited to receive these gifts at Christmas time. Each box is stuffed with items worth more than \$35 and also packed for boys and girls seperately

CHRISTMAS SHOE BOX GIFT PROGRAM TO ORPHANS AND NEEDY AROUND THE COUNTRY

We started our Shoe box program in 2013 and sent nearly two hundred (200) boxes to various orphanages and needy places. However there were popular demand from orphanages and others to increase the number of shoe boxes as children rejoice to open them and normally these items are beyond their means to purchase.

We increased the number of boxes to five hundred (500) in the year 2014. Packing these items was strenuous. Both MFT and community members bought and packed the shoe boxes given to them with the items listed however the items were resorted and packed to make sure everyone gets the same items. It is also sorted and repacked for boys and girls separately. It is a joy to make these children in different orphanages happy.



The volunteers worked many days to sort these items and repack them. We then pack them in shipping boxes and send them to Sri Lanka.



We raised more than \$200,000 to help the people in the camps and visited many camps and helped them personally. Fr.Asanka Ratnayake and Rev.Oral Singh worked as a team in purchasing the goods in Colombo and taking them through Madawachi check point. After the war we built temporary housing. Also shipped 600 boxes of clothes (Container) to Srilanka. Ps Sherina was personally in the refugee camps and distributed them and other items to refugees and pregnant women.

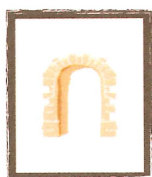
